The Warehouse line currently offers three products: a 20 pack of regular liners, a 10 pack of regular pads and 10 pack of super pads.

Women's Refuge chief executive, Dr Ang Jury says, "Women leaving an abuser and entering our services, often do so with very little, as reaching safety is the obvious priority. That is why we are so grateful for this initiative that will take one less concern away from our clients during a traumatic time."
